#### SECTION A

- 1. What role was God thought to play in epidemics in medieval and early modern times?
- 2. "The physic garden was as important as the anatomy theatre in the development of medicine in the Renaissance." Do you agree?
- 3. Discuss the role of practical technologies in providing models for understanding the functioning of man and animals in the early modern period.
- 4. Why has the stethoscope been claimed as the emblematic instrument of Paris Hospital Medicine?
- 5. Political economy or political medicine? Which term most aptly describes the nineteenth-century sanitarian movement?
- 6. Assess the relationship between medical technology and disease identity since around 1900.

### **SECTION B**

- 7. Is it permissible for a physician knowingly to kill a patient if she did not intend the death of the patient?
- 8. Do we have an obligation to participate in medical research? What does your answer imply about the role of informed consent in research?
- 9. What is the best way to allocate scarce medical resources?
- 10. Which factual questions, if any, are relevant to the morality of abortion?
- 11. What is Parfit's non-identity problem and what are its implications for the use of reproductive technologies?
- 12. How can problems with using social categories in medical research be avoided or at least mitigated?
